



Level 2 Certificate in Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools

Introduction/Summary

Our Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools Certificate will allow your staff to develop the skills and knowledge needed to support children and young people to gain the best start in life and provide them with a safe and secure environment. The qualification is delivered on a 1:1 basis within your school environment.

This programme is aimed at recognising and developing the professional status of this important role in schools. The learner will cover all the key elements needed for this profession. They will be working under the direction of a teacher, contributing to preparing the classroom for learning activities and working with individual pupils, who require extra support.

Qualification Structure

To help your staff develop a tailored programme which meets their specific needs, learners will have an initial assessment interview with their assigned Learning and Development Mentor (LDM) before they get started on their qualification.

This assessment interview looks at what their current role is, analyses their skills, and then identifies the most relevant optional units for them to take. The qualification contains the following mandatory units. Alongside these there are a range of optional units to support specialisms that can be used to make up the certificate:

- Child and young person development
- Safeguarding the welfare of children and young people
- Communication and professional relationships with children, young people and adults
- Equality, diversity and inclusion in work with children and young people
- Help improve own and team practice in schools
- Maintain and support relationships with children and young people
- Support children and young people's health and safety
- Support children and young people's positive behaviour
- Support learning activities

The qualification requires candidates to achieve 24 credits from the mandatory units and a minimum of 6 credits from the optional units.

Requirements

You must be working in a school environment to meet the competency units of this certificate.

There are no minimum requirements for entry onto this course but a level 2 in English and Math's is needed to work in most schools.
